CAADC Opens New Office in Upper Darby!

Community Action Agency of Delaware County, Inc. (CAADC) has opened an additional Direct Service Office in Upper Darby. CAADC felt there was a need to provide a readily accessible service site in eastern Delaware County due to all the low- and moderate-income households that have suffered negative economic impacts from the COVID-19 Pandemic. Services provided will include referrals to County shelters and temporary emergency shelter as well as rental, utility and food assistance.

A grand opening and ribbon cutting ceremony occurred on Wednesday September 14th. Funding for the site is a COVID-19 ARPA Pandemic Response Grant through the Pennsylvania Department of Community and Economic Development.

Program Spotlight: SNAP/Food Stamp Outreach Project

There are many families in Delaware County that cannot afford to sufficiently provide a healthy and nutritious diet for their children. There are also many seniors that cannot make ends meet anymore during difficult financial times and need some extra help.

Residents may be eligible for Food Stamps, also now known as Supplemental Nutritional Assistance Program (SNAP). CAADC helps these families through the SNAP/Food Stamp Outreach Project. Last year the Project helped over 500 families register for assistance. Over the years it has helped over 10,000 households to receive assistance.

The Project is an outreach program to assist low-income individuals and families in understanding and applying for participation in the SNAP/Food Stamp Program. Eligible applicants no longer need to apply at the County Assistance Office but can do so directly through our Program.

Volunteers Needed for Tax Assistance Program

Community Action Agency of Delaware County, Inc. (CAADC) will once again be providing Volunteer Income Tax Assistance (VITA) sites in Delaware County. VITA sites aim to serve families who qualify for the Earned Income Tax Credit and Child Tax Credit with free tax preparation.

CAADC will be doing in-person preparation at a variety of sites in Delaware County.



CAADC will also utilize PPE equipment as necessary at all of its sites.

CAADC needs many volunteers as during these difficult times we are looking to help families more than ever. Last year CAADC was able to help almost 1,000 households and expects to exceed that number this year. After the Pandemic, CAADC is one of the few organizations that continue to provide this necessary assistance.

Positions include tax preparers, volunteer schedulers, screeners, greeters and quality reviewers. No experience is necessary as training, IRS-certification and resources will be provided.
